# Curriculum Outline Autumn 2013



Year Group: Reception

### Personal Social and Emotional Development

We will be looking at our similarities and differences through celebrations and traditions.

We will continue playing ring games to help strengthen and expand the children's friendship groups. We will also explore different feelings through our relationships with one another, and help children express their own needs and wants in appropriate ways.

### **Communication and Language**

Our core rhymes this term are:

Tommy Thumb and 1,2, 3, 4, 5 Once I caught a fish alive.

All children will be expected to learn and sing these rhymes.

The children will be share-reading traditional tales and will be encouraged to these stories in their own words.

Children will be given lots of opportunities to practise their speaking and listening skills for example, sharing information about their traditions and celebrations. We encourage our children to speak like scholars by using full sentences.

### Literacy

**Phonics** - Most children will be focusing on blending sounds into words (reading) and segmenting simple words into sounds (writing). Some children may need to revisit the sounds we have learnt while others will be ready to learn a new set of sounds.

**Writing -** The children will be given lots of opportunities to write e.g. wish lists, greeting, cards, letters to Santa, invitations and recipes.

**Reading -** We will share read a range of books to encourage children to understand English reading conventions and reading strategies. We are focusing on Traditional Tales and stories of Celebration.

#### **Mathematics**

The children will be focusing on counting, recognising, and writing numbers to 20.

We will be exploring the language of more and fewer by finding one more and one less than a given number. We will also begin simple addition and subtraction problems.

We will be exploring shapes and patterns in our environment. Sequencing daily events and calendar maths.

Our core rhyme is:

1,2, 3, 4, 5 Once I caught a fish alive.

#### **Physical Development**

Throughout the term we will talk about the importance of having good health through physical exercise.

We will develop fine motor skills through cutting and mark making activities. We will also learn how to manipulate clay and shaping tools to make divas.

### **Understanding the World**

The children will learn about different cultures and celebrations e.g. Remembrance, Diwali, Guy Fawkes Night and Christmas.

We will explore light and day through stories such as Owl Babies and Day Monkey, Night Monkey. Children will also be able to explore the difference between night and day. Through making Dens.

We will also be exploring pattern and change by looking at the weather.

### **Expressive Arts and Design**

This half term we will explore colour, form, shape and pattern through the different festivals. We will create Rangoli patterns, Firework art, Christmas wrapping paper and clay divas.

In our role play areas we will re-enact Christmas traditions such as eating Christmas dinner, decorating the Christmas tree and visiting Santa. We will also pretend to be Santa's little helpers in Santa's workshop and deliver present on his sleigh.
